SCALE JUDGING RULES

The below rules can also be found in the GLMBA Rule Book.

SCALE JUDGING

1. Proof of authenticity of any prototype scale model is the responsibility of the contestant and must be presented in the event a boat is challenged by the judges. Photographs, blueprints or documentation will be acceptable evidence and this material shall accompany the model.
2. Challenge of entries by contestants will not be entertained unless proof is presented about the questioned model.
3. Model entries must be sixty percent complete in the opinion of the judges in order to be eligible for judging.
4. At least 90% of the total workmanship on the model entry must have been performed by the entrant, in the judge's opinion, for it to be eligible for judging.

Scale Point Judging Structure

1. Construction - 0-25 Points: This factor deals with the apparent workmanship of the builder (entrant). Proper handling of materials, applied labour, skill and craftsmanship as demonstrated by construction are considered.
2. Detail - 0-25 Points. This factor deals with the refinement of the model. The number of subordinate parts added as well as the complexity of the model is considered.
3. Conformity - 0-15 Points: This factor deals with what is commonly called "standard practice". Logical construction and application of parts are considered to be conforming to the prototype.
4. Finish - 0-15 Points: This factor deals with the general appearance of the model as reflected by the treatment of the surface of the model through the use of proper materials, painting, aging, etc., to achieve a specific effect. Aging and weathering special effects and are considered "finishes".
5. Scratch building - 0-20 Points: This factor deals with all parts of the model which have been fabricated by the builder. Pre-formed wood, plastics and metal are considered basic materials for scratch building.
